2019 Miller Trust Grant Awards Announced

Wyckoff, New Jersey, December 19th, 2019: In 2002, the George Sydney and Phyllis Redman Miller Trust designated Winn Feline Foundation as one of its advisor organizations. The total grant funding varies each year.
